Where is Palestine located?

Palestine,<sup>[i ]</sup>officially the State of Palestine,<sup>[ii ]</sup>[e ]is a country in the southern Levant region of West Asia recognized by 146 out of 193 UN member states.

Is Palestine a member state or a non-member observer?

It is recognized by 145 United Nations member states in May 2024. Since 2012, it has non-member observer status in the United Nations. This amounts to a de facto, or implicit, recognition of statehood. The Palestinian National Authority claims the West Bank and the Gaza Strip as its territory.

Is Palestine a state or a country?

The 1968 Palestinian National Covenant described Palestine as the "homeland of the Arab Palestinian people", with "the boundaries it had during the British Mandate". However, since the 1988 Palestinian Declaration of Independence, the term State of Palestine refers only to the West Bank and the Gaza Strip.

Is Palestine a good country?

Despite these challenges, the country remains one of the most highly-educated countries in the Arab world, maintains an emerging economy, and sees frequent tourism. As of May 2024, Palestine is recognized as a sovereign state by 145 out of 193 member states of the United Nations.

Why is Palestine an observer state?

Status as an observer state in the UN allows the State of Palestine to participate in general debate at the General Assembly, to co-sponsor resolutions, to join treaties and specialized UN agencies.

When did Palestine become a member state?

In 1989, an application for the admission of Palestine as a member state was submitted by a group of seven states during the 131st session of UNESCO's executive board. The board postponed a decision until the next session, and the item was included on each session's agenda thereafter, being repeatedly deferred.
